Doosan Forklift Part - Doosan Infracore Company Ltd. is a transnational company consisting of Diesel Engines, Defense Industry goods, Industrial Vehicles, Construction Equipment and Machine Instruments and Automation Systems.

In the U.S.A., Doosan Infracore America Corporation is headquartered in Suwanee, Georgia. It is home to a 170,000 square foot manufacturing facility, which is the home of the Compact Equipment and Construction division. West Caldwell, New Jersey is home to the Machine Tool division and Cleveland, Garland is home to the Lift truck division. The U.S. headquarters in Georgia facilitates a first rate parts operation capable of supplying an excess of 25,000 line items to support Lift Truck, Compact Equipment, Machine Tool and Construction customer desires.

With a system consisting of over 90 independent dealers, the lift truck group provides quality materials handling equipment to the comprehensive North American market. Doosan Infracore America Forklift sellers successfully operate in over 220 service and product sales places all through Canada and the U.S. The lift truck product line impressively features 63 different machines consisting of 82 various battery and engine configurations of Electric-powered and Internal Combustion lift trucks. Capacities of these various vehicle models range from 3,000 to 33,000 lbs. All trucks are designed in an ISO 9001 qualified facility.

Doosan Infracore America is the fastest rising forklift and lift truck corporation in the North American marketplace, due to its outstanding level of product performance and their consistently high level of customer support and service given to all Doosan Infracore Forklift clients. The U.S. lift Truck division located in Cleveland has a skilled team knowledgeable in Product Sales, Purchasing, Advertising, Logistical and Technical Support.

Originally the home-based lift truck market in Korea was an open import enterprise. Korea Machinery Co. Ltd. started in 1960, to import fully assembled lift trucks as part of a domestic equipment expansion venture. Sales of these products were primarily targeted to state-run corporations, large scale organizations, and the military. This ultimately led to a merger with Daewoo Heavy Industries Ltd. In 1976, the Forklift Division begun business operations throughout Korea to overhaul and sell this heavy equipment. By 1978, a forklift manufacturing plant was successfully completed. Continuous technical training became the new focus for enhancing quality and product development.

Home-based lift truck business for Daewoo started in 1967 and grew to an astounding 90% market share in Korea. By the 1980's, Daewoo's sophisticated technological improvements combined with sales success placed them in a situation of considerable expansion of their forklift business.

In 1981, Caterpillar Industrial Inc. of the United States, proposed a joint enterprise project to respond to competitive pressures in the US materials handling industry. This endeavor greatly expanded Daewoo's lift truck sales. Construction was completed in 1984 to facilitate a contemporary plant which helped set up the business for the fabrication of high added-value goods suitable for export. In 1993, the corporation had a international sales system and started exporting models they had established through in-house expertise, as an sovereign brand. Certifications were then acquired from CE of Europe, UL of the United States and ISO 14001 and ISO 9001, securing expansion opportunities into international markets.
